Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of half year and year to date standalone financial results of **Tarini International Limited** (the "Company") for the half year ended March 31, 2026 and for the year ended March 31, 2026 ("Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI Listing Regulations.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the possible effects of matter described in "Basis for Qualified Opinion" paragraph, the Statement:

- i. is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net loss and other financial information of the Company for the half year ended March 31, 2026 and for the year ended March 31, 2026.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

We refer to Note 6 wherein the accumulated losses of subsidiaries which have suffered recurring losses and have a net capital deficiency and the management of that subsidiary have prepared the financials on the assumption of going concern. The investment of Rs. 121.59 Lakhs in such subsidiaries has been considered good by the management and no provision for diminution in the investment has been made. In the absence of any operational plan on records, we are unable to comment upon the management's assessment. Had the provision been made in the books of account, the profit before tax for the year would have been converted into loss amounting to Rs. 43.20 Lakhs.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results" section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI") together with the



ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the financial results.

Emphasis of Matter

We refer to following notes of the statement of audited financial results:

- (a) Note 7, wherein the receivables, loans and advances are subject to confirmation but considered good and recoverable by the management. In absence of confirmation and having regard to the age of these balances, we are unable to comment the extent to which these balances are recoverable.
- (b) Note 8, wherein an asset being Farm house of the company was provisionally attached by Enforcement Directorate in the month of October 2017 and the company has obtained stay against said attachment from Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide order dated March 06, 2018
- (c) Note 9, wherein the Company has approached Hon'ble Supreme Court under section 15-Z of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 against the Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) order dated 02.05.2022 imposing penalty of Rs. 505 Lakhs. The appeal stands admitted and to be listed for hearing.
- (d) Note 10, wherein the Registrar of Companies (ROC) had filed complaints before the Trial Court pursuant to show cause notices issued under various sections of the Companies Act, 2013. The respective Hon'ble Court has dismissed seven such cases in favor of the Company.

Our conclusion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Management's Responsibilities for the Standalone Financial Results

The Statement has been prepared on the basis of the standalone annual financial statements. The Board of Directors of the Company are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Statement that gives a true and fair view of the net profit/loss of the Company and other financial information in accordance with the applicable accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Statement, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.



Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Statement as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of the Statement.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Statement, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under Section 143(3)(i) of the Act, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the company has adequate internal financial controls with reference to financial statements in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Board of Directors.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Board of Directors' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial results or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Statement, including the disclosures, and whether the Statement represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.



Other Matter

The Statement include the results for the half year ended March 31, 2026 being the balancing figure being the audited figures in respect of full financial year ended March 31, 2026 and the published unaudited first half year of the current financial year which were subjected to limited review by us.

- The figures for the half-year ended March 31, 2026 are the balancing figures between the audited figures of full financial year and the published half year figures upto September 30, 2025.
- The financial result has been prepared on the basis of accrual accounting policy and in accordance with uniform accounting practices adopted for the periods.
- Statutory Auditor of the Company have included a qualified opinion in their audit report for the year ended March 31, 2026 pertaining to the investments resulting in accumulated losses of the subsidiaries which have eroded its (subsidiaries) net worth as at March 31, 2026. The management of the subsidiaries is confident of improvement in the company's future operation. Financial statements have been prepared on going concern basis. The company is of the view that the investments of Rs. 121.59 Lakhs in the subsidiary companies is a long term investment and no provision for diminution in value of investment is necessary.
- In the opinion of the management, the balances shown under receivables, loans and advances and other assets whether current or non current have approximately the same realisable value has shown in the account. However, these balances are subject to confirmation. The Statutory auditors of the company has included a emphasis of matter in their audit report for the year ended March 31, 2026.
- In the month of October, 2017, an asset being Farm house of the company was provisionally attached by Enforcement Directorate arbitrarily without the company being an accused in any form whatsoever and the company has obtained absolute stay order against the said "arbitrary attachment" from Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide order dated March 06, 2018.
- The Company has filed Civil Appeal in Hon'ble Supreme Court in the year 2022 under section 15-Z of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 against the Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) order dated 02.05.2022 pursuant to 12 years old case resulting in WTM and AO order dated 29.03.2019 and 20.02.2020 respectively. The appeal stands admitted.
- ROC had filed complaints before the trial court pursuant to Show Cause Notices issued under various sections of the Companies Act, 2013. The respective Hon'ble Court has dismissed seven such cases in favour of the company.
- As per MCA notification dated 16.02.2015, companies whose shares are listed on SME exchange as referred to in Chapter XB of SEBI(ICDR) Regulation, 2009 are exempted from the compulsory requirement of adoption of IND-AS

In preparing the Statement, the respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group and of its associates are responsible for assessing the ability of the Group and of its associates to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the respective Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Group or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the Circular No. CIR/CFD/CMD1/44/2019 dated March 29, 2019 issued by the Securities Exchange Board of India under Regulation 33 (8) of the Listing Regulations, to the extent applicable.

Other Matter

1. The accompanying Statement includes the audited financial results/statements and other financial information, in respect of 2 subsidiaries, whose financial results/statements reflect Group's share of total assets of Rs. 40.80 lakhs as at March 31, 2026, Group's share of total revenues of Rs. 24.42 lakhs and Rs. 15.42 Lakhs, Group's share of total net loss after tax of Rs. 17.09 Lakhs and Rs. 9.00 Lakhs, for the half year and the year ended on that date respectively, and net cash flows of Rs. 9.77 Lakhs for the year ended March 31, 2026, as considered in the Statement which have been audited by their respective independent auditors.
2. The accompanying Statement also includes the unaudited financial results/statements and other financial information, in respect of 2 associates, whose financial results/statements reflect Group's share of profits of Rs. 129.71 Lakhs for the year ended on March 31, 2026.



3. The independent auditor's report on the financial statements/financial results/financial information of these entities have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the Statement in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries, is based solely on the reports of such auditors and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph above.

Our opinion on the Statement is not modified in respect of the above matters with respect to our reliance on the work done and the reports of the other auditors.

4. The Statement include the results for the half year ended March 31, 2026 being the balancing figure being the audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published unaudited first half year of the current financial year which were subjected to limited review by us.

- The Group does not have more than one reportable primary segment in terms of Accounting Standard 17 (AS 17- Segment Reporting) issued by the ICAI/ Company (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2021, therefore the company is not required to submit separate segment wise report.
- The figures for the half-year ended March 31, 2026 are the balancing figures between the audited figures of full financial year and the published half year figures upto September 30, 2025.
- The financial result has been prepared on the basis of accrual accounting policy and in accordance with uniform accounting practices adopted for the periods.
- Statutory Auditor of the Company have included a qualified opinion in their audit report for the year ended March 31, 2026 pertaining to the investments resulting in accumulated losses of the subsidiaries which have eroded its (subsidiaries) net worth as at March 31, 2026. The management of the subsidiaries is confident of improvement in the company's future operation. Financial statements have been prepared on going concern basis. The company is of the view that the investments of Rs. 121.59 Lakhs in the subsidiary companies is a long term investment and no provision for diminution in value of investment is necessary.
- Consolidated financial results have been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standard 21 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.
- In the opinion of the management, the balances shown under receivables, loans and advances and other assets whether current or non current have approximately the same realisable value has shown in the account. However, these balances are subject to confirmation. The Statutory auditors of the Company has included a emphasis of matter in their audit report for the year ended March 31, 2026.
- In the month of October, 2017, an asset being Farm house of the company was provisionally attached by Enforcement Directorate arbitrarily without the company being an accused in any form whatsoever and the company has obtained absolute stay order against the said "arbitrary attachment" from Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide order dated March 06, 2018.
- The Company has filed Civil Appeal in Hon'ble Supreme Court in the year 2022 under section 15-Z of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 against the Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) order dated 02.05.2022 pursuant to 12 years old case resulting in WTM and AO order dated 29.03.2019 and 20.02.2020 respectively. The appeal stands admitted.
- ROC had filed complaints before the trial court pursuant to Show Cause Notices issued under various sections of the Companies Act, 2013. The respective Hon'ble Court has dismissed seven such cases in favour of the company.
- As per MCA notification dated 16.02.2015, companies whose shares are listed on SME exchange as referred to in Chapter XB of SEBI(ICDR) Regulation, 2009 are exempted from the compulsory requirement of adoption of IND-AS
- Figures of the previous year have been re-grouped, re-arranged wherever considered necessary.




